
#### Lego League

Last Tuesday the Year 1/2 authors and illustrators invited their families upstairs into their learning spaces to share their amazing Hero books! We celebrated the writing process that the Year 1/2s were involved in, through drafting, editing and publishing their Hero narrative books! Each student used their incredible imaginations to design a hero, which they made a poster for and created out of lego, plasticine or 3D printed using Maker's Empire and these heroes were the protagonists for our books! Students initially drafted and co-edited, through writing conferences. They then illustrated the typed and edited copy of the book, painting their front covers to give the complete published and bound book which we shared on Tuesday! Our books followed the structure of a hero's journey and included many writing crafting and illustrative devices such as onomatopoeia, sizzling start, big and bold, show not tell, punctuation for emphasis such as ellipses, direct speech with dialogue tags, close up visuals, background details and more! We are so proud of our efforts and we had an amazing time sharing our journey with our families, other students, teachers and leadership at our book launch! •























# Rooms 6/7 Marine Discovery Centre

On Thursday, November 10<sup>th</sup> Rooms 6 and 7 visited the Marine Discovery Centre as part of our STEM research projects this semester. We have been learning about marine habitats and how we can help preserve these unique environments.



First, we went beachcombing along Henley Beach, where we observed the marine and beach habitats and collected and identified the plant and animal specimens we found there. We also picked up lots of litter on the beach including wrappers, little bits of plastic, fishing line and bottle caps.



Before we left, we returned all the natural habitat specimens to the beach and we removed and disposed of all the litter we found. The beach was much cleaner when we left it!







In the Marine Discovery Centre we learned about the local plant and animal species that are a part of our local marine habitat. We went on a virtual reality scuba dive with seals and learned about how long it takes for different types of litter to breakdown in our environment.



Did you know some things can take up to 600 years or even a million years to breakdown in the environment? Make sure your litter goes in the bin and not in our ocean!
