A3 and A4 SA Museum Excursion

On 16 May rooms A3 and A4 walked to Islington Station and caught a train to the SA Museum to look at Australian Aboriginal and artefacts. It was the starting point to our investigation about Aboriginal Australians that we have named The Makarrata Project. We started with two questions:

1. Aboriginal Peoples have lived here for at least 60 000 years. Other people have lived here for less than 246 years. What are you wondering?
2. Makarrata is a word in the Yolngu language meaning a coming together after a struggle, facing the facts of wrongs and living again in peace. What are you wondering?

The excursion was a lot of fun and students had great questions and saw many beautiful and amazing artefacts.



Science

The focus area of science of this term was Earth and Space. Each year level has had a different focus level.

Reception students are learning how daily and seasonal changes in our environment affect everyday life.

Year 1 students have been investigating and record observable changes occurring in the sky and landscape.

The year 2 students have focused on Earth's resources and how they are used in a variety of ways.

Year 3 students have been focusing on learning about the Earth's rotation on its axis and how this causes regular changes, including night and day.

Year 4 students are studying how Earth's surface changes over time as a result of natural processes and human activity.

The year 5 students are investigating how the Earth is part of a system of planets orbiting around a star (the Sun).

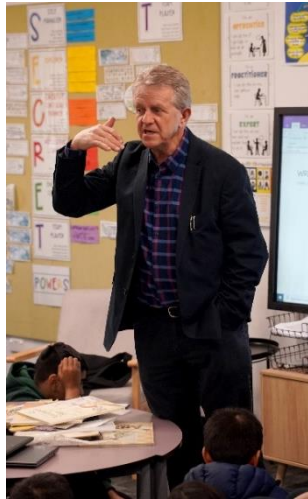
Year 6 students have focused on how sudden geological changes and extreme weather events can affect Earth's surface.

Our HASS Design Thinking project has well and truly begun this term. We have been exploring Aboriginal culture and history, through the lens of examining Connection to Country.

During our Immersion phase we have explored artefacts and photographs, created artworks, participated in dance workshops, taken part in an outdoor nature incursion, listened to Dreamtime stories and more!

We have recently been working on re-creating and sharing knowledge from some of these Dreamtime stories in our own way – including through dance, Minecraft, making dioramas, Maker’s Empire (for 3D printing) and Lego. We have also used Google Maps to explore some of the sacred sites from the Dreamtime stories – Tjilbruke, 7 Sisters and Ngurunderi.
