





## **Design Thinking Process**

We used the Design Thinking
Process to help us learn more
about natural disasters and
come up with solutions for many
problems caused by them.

Immersion - during immersion we investigated all about the different natural disasters. We learnt how they are caused, what are the key features and the impact they can have on the surroundings.

**Synthesis** - we looked at everything that we learnt and made connections using hexagonal thinking.

Ideation - We came up with 'how can we...' questions to help us solve problems caused by our chosen natural disaster.

**Prototype** - In our small groups we created prototypes of our solutions.
