
Governing Council still has a vacancy for any parent who is interested in joining our team, please approach your teacher or the front office



A3 and A4 have installed a weather station in the garden with a wireless monitor that is in the classroom. We can look at inside and outside temperature, wind speed and direction, rainfall as well as many other things. It will be useful for data collection and displays in maths.




School Payments

If you need to make cash payments to the school, the correct money would be appreciated.










Performing Arts


In Performing Arts this term the year 3/4 classes have been learning a variety of drama games. These fun games are to improve their confidence, their communication and teamwork and oracy skills through improvisation. Some of the games include Shazam! Human Knot and Twenty One.

Our favourite parts were filming the expo for PNTV, showing special people our final products and receiving positive and constructive feedback on our learning processes.














As part of WRITER's WORKSHOP Room 7 are taking on the challenge of writing an adventure story!
