
Theatre Academy, the performances were amazing, congratulations Claire!

In 2024 PNPS will re-join the Primary Schools Music Festival with our own local choir.

While there is a \$20 fee for joining – this is heavily subsidised and for this one off payment your child will

- Rehearse each week with a fantastic repertoire with an accompanist from DfE and Judy as choir leader
- Have the opportunity to sing in harmony with others from their own copy of the songbook
- Have access to online backing tracks / versions of all the songs in the program
- Have access to the App which will include all the music, and allow the user to
 - o Listen to the songs and sing along
 - o Choose your part in learning or practice mode
 - o Skip to a section or repeat an echo track
 - o Adjust the playback speed to help learn tricky bits
 - o Watch and learn the choreography
 - o Adjust the volume of any part especially when singing in 3 part harmony
- Be transported to a full rehearsal with a choir of 400 others
- Have an opportunity to perform on the stage of the Festival Theatre (in September) with a 400 strong voice choir, orchestra and dance troupe.
- Have an opportunity to audition for solos or to be a speaking host in the concert series
