






World Teacher's Day

Term 4 Science

In the year 5 and 6 classes, we have been covering the topic of chemical science. Specifically, the year 5 group have been learning that solids, liquids and gases having different observable properties and behave in different ways, while the year 6 students have been learning that changes to materials can be reversible or irreversible.

Future investigations will involve irreversible reactions



Photograph one and two shows an investigation we carried out to demonstrate the states of matter, being solid, liquid and gas. Using a candle as a heat source, the students changed water (being a liquid) to steam (gas). We then discussed how we could reverse the process to change the gas back into a liquid and then into a solid. We will follow on from this investigation to melt ice (solid) to a liquid then to gas so the students can discuss the properties of each state of matter.
